

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to this anthology celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Alternative New Year's Day Spoken Word / Performance Extravaganza.

It's unbelievable that an event that started out with a whisper and a prayer has been up and running for going on two decades.

This is the first anthology that we have undertaken, although during the very early years we asked participants to bring multiple copies of a piece of writing for a collating effort, and a special issue of Stained Sheets (a broadside I used to edit under the auspices of ABC NO RIO) featured very short poems by writers responding to the theme of our third year which was El Niño.

We wish we could have given all the writers / performers featured in the 2014 event a chance to appear in print but our early submission deadline precluded that from happening; in the natural and normal course of events some people were invited to perform after the deadline.

The Alternative (as we call it for short) started on January 1st, 1995 at Café Nico on Avenue A between East 6th and 7th Streets in the East Village (above the legendary Pyramid Club).

Larry Jones was the proprietor of the club and opened its doors to us for five fabulous years of high energy and raucous celebrations of the spoken word, performance, music, and dance.

One prize memory – lining the steps up to Nico with absconded copies of The Village Voice (which failed to even list our event) so that attendees could deservedly trample them.

From there we moved for two years to the now late lamented CBGB'S and then for two years to the Knitting Factory on Leonard Street in Tribecca (the first year in the wake of 911), and then for nine years to our longtime home at the Bowery Poetry Club (a big thank you to Bob Holman), last year to Dixon Place (thank you Ellie Covan), and now a new era dawning as we celebrate our anniversary at the great Nuyorican Poets Café (thank you Daniel Gallant and Jason Quinones).

There have been many wrinkles thrown in as the years have gone by — this year the anthology and last as well as this the incorporation of images drawn from the work of artists who participate in the ambitious holiday show at Richie Timperio's Sideshow Gallery on Bedford Avenue in Williamsburg.


